### teaching notes

The spellings <gue> and <que> are typically found at the end of words although suffixes might then be added (fa|tigues, u|nique|ly).

The spelling <gue> most commonly represents /g/ as in the above word list, but can also represent /g/+/yoo/ (ar | <u>aue</u>) and /g/+/ae/ (me | ren | <u>aue</u>).\*

The spelling <que> most commonly represents /k/ as in the above word list, but can also represent /k/+/yoo/ (bar|be|que) /k/+/ae/ (a|ppli|que).

Both the <gue> and <que> spellings tend to denote words of French origin:

morgue derives from the French La Morgue, the name of a building in Paris where dead bodies were kept for identification, and before that where prisoners were kept, and probably named mosque derives from the Middle French 'mosquée', itself deriving from the Arabic 'masjid' (temple, place of worship)

To investigate the origins and meanings of other words in the word list, visit etymonline.com.

You might sort words into the <gue> and <que> spellings. A word sort has been included for this purpose. When identifying a pattern within the word sort you might note that:

- both <gue> and <que> occur at the end of words
- <gue> represents /g/
- <que> represents /k/

<sup>\*&</sup>lt;ngue> can represent /ng/ (tongue, me | ringue).
